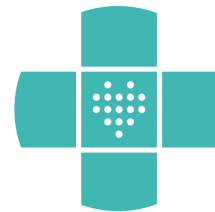

When I first arrived at Borland Free Clinic in April 2020 – about one month into the Covid-19 pandemic – I was blown away by the impact the clinic was making in the lives of individuals; by the resourcefulness of its staff and volunteers in the face of unprecedented challenges; and by the dedication of its supports and partners through it all.

It's also amazing to recognize that during 2022 we will mark the conclusion of our fifth year serving our patients since the clinic first opened its doors to offer pre-Diabetes education in 2017. During this time the clinic has not just come a long way; it has thrived.

At Borland Free Clinic, we believe that everyone should have access to compassionate, dignified, excellent medical care. At the heart of our work is the “hope through healing” we provide people who need medical care, yet for different reasons are unable to get it.

Having increased our patient volume, added a prayer team, and started a Women's Health Clinic, among other things, this past year I believe we have done just that.

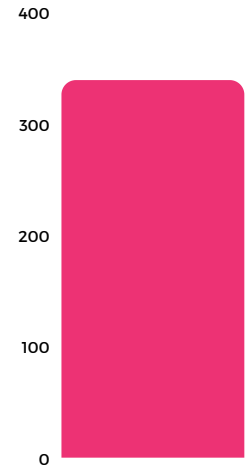
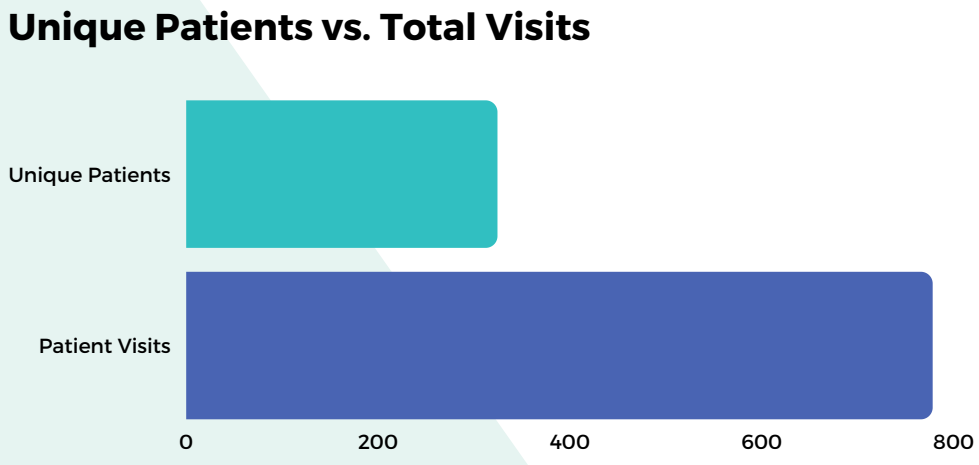

PATIENT NUMBERS

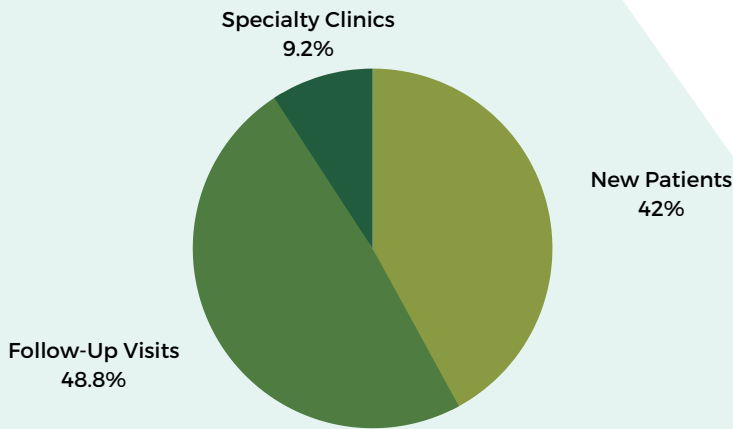
BFC offers comprehensive medical care, including primary care, Diabetes education, and some specialty clinics (Physical Therapy, Gynecology, Vision/Dental vans).

Community Benefit Dollars

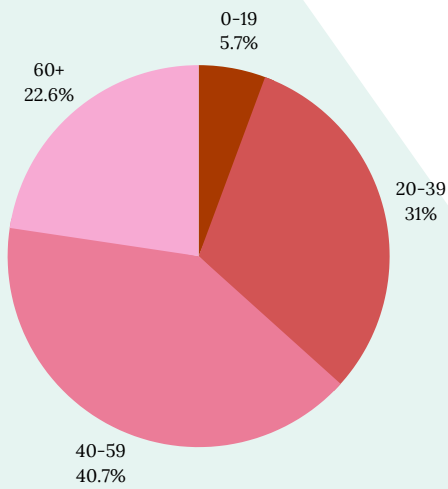

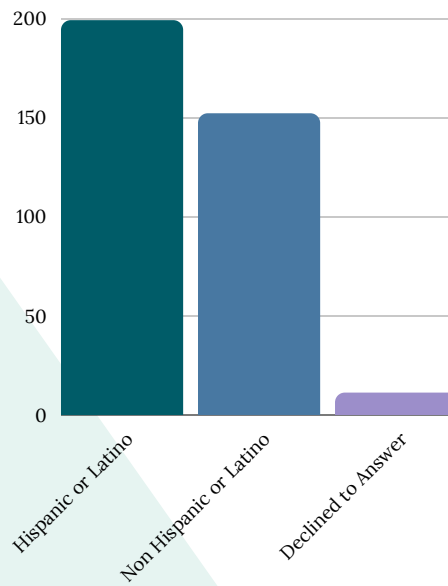
DEMOGRAPHICS

BFC serves uninsured individuals with household incomes at or below 300% of the federal poverty guidelines.

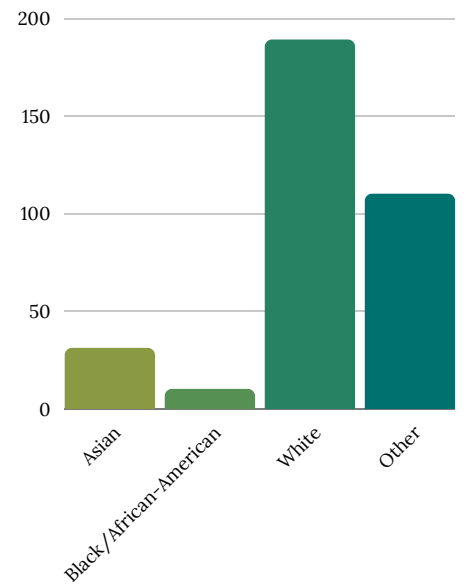
Age

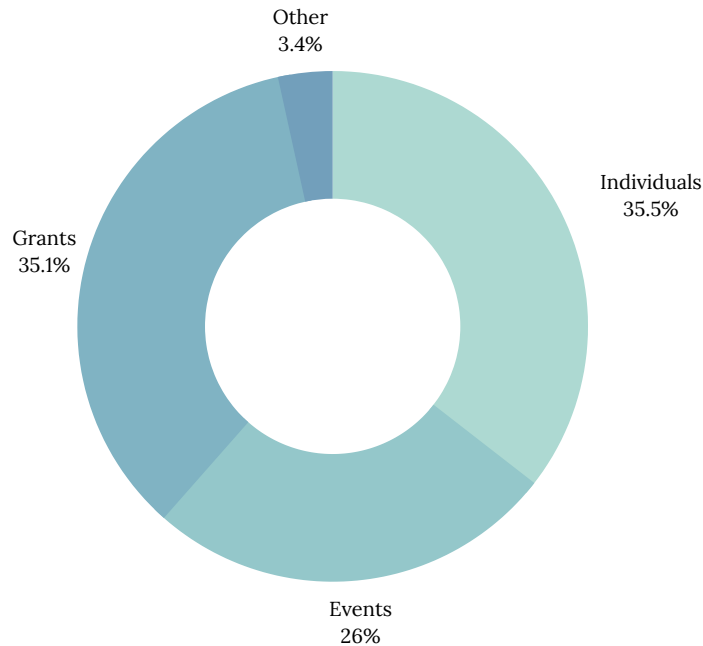
